In the Event of Injury or Illness:

- 1. In the event of an injury or illness that is life-threatening, call 911 IMMEDIATELY. Life-threatening injuries and illnesses include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Any incident in which the victim is rendered unconscious.
 - B. Any incident in which the victim has stopped breathing or is having difficulty breathing.
 - C. Any incident in which the victim does not display a pulse.
 - D. Any Incident in which the victim is bleeding profusely.
 - E. Any incident in which the victim has suffered paralysis to any extent.
- 2. After calling 911, call Health Services, then the Police Department
- 3. In the event of a non-life-threatening injury or illness call Heath Services. If no answer, call the Police Department
- 4. Do not move an injured person unless absolutely necessary to prevent additional injury. If the victim must be moved, pull the body lengthwise. When lifting a victim, support each section of the body so "jackknifing" does not occur.
- 5. Make the victim as comfortable as possible until professional help arrives.
 - A. Cover the victim with a blanket or coat to keep him/her warm.
 - B. If there is no breathing or pulse, apply mouth-to-mouth resuscitation or CPR (If you are certified to do so).
 - C. If vomiting occurs in an unconscious person, turn the head to one side to prevent choking.
 - D. To stop bleeding, elevate the extremity and apply pressure.
 - E. If shortness of breath occurs, elevate the head.

In the Event of Criminal Activity and Traffic Accidents:

- 1. In the event of criminal activity or traffic accidents that are, or have the potential to be, life-threatening, call 911 IMMEDIATELY
- 2, After calling 911, call the Police Department
- 3. In the event of non-life-threatening criminal activity or traffic accidents, call the Police Department
- 4. When calling 911 and the police regarding criminal activity, give as much detail as possible regarding the type of crime, type and extent of injuries (if any), and a description of the perpetrator(s) to include how many there are, their general physical and clothing description, and how they are armed (if applicable).
- 5. When calling 911 and the police regarding traffic accidents, be specific as to the exact location, number and type of vehicles involved, whether there is a road blockage, and the type and extent of injuries (if any).
