

LAKE LAND COLLEGE

FEDERAL FUNDING INFORMATION

Lake Land is a community college that serves more than 17,000 students a year through transfer ready, workforce ready, non-credit and continuing education programs. Lake Land serves a nearly 4,000 square mile district encompassing 53 communities and 31 public school districts. In addition, Lake Land provides educational programs to 23 adult correctional and two juvenile centers throughout the state. Lake Land has been named in the top 150 community colleges in the nation four times by the Aspen Institute, and has been recently recognized in the top 100 community colleges nationwide for completion

rates by CNN Money. Students are able to choose from more than 150 majors, with enrollment split between Workforce Ready and Transfer Ready programs.

STUDENT SUCCESS

- ♦ Lake Land College graduates who transfer to state universities earn grades that are higher than those who start at the same university as freshmen.
- ♦ Graduates of a Lake Land College Workforce Ready program can expect to earn 39 percent more over their lifetime than those not

completing a community college program. The average Lake Land College graduate can expect to earn about a half of a million dollars more over a lifetime than a non-graduate.

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT

- ♦ Almost 900 full-time and part-time staff live in the Lake Land College district, contributing to the local communities and economies.
