This model program assumes the Lake Land College Business Administration majors while in high school have completed two years in the same foreign language with a grade of C or better. Foreign Language in college is not required for admission or graduation from the College of Business if a student has at least 24 college hours completed when they transfer.

Students who have not satisfied this requirement will be required to complete six semester hours of college credit in the same foreign language with a grade of C or better. These hours may be competed at Lake Land College or at the transfer institution.

Students who plan to transfer to NIU without AS degrees will need to be very careful in selecting courses at Lake Land College that will satisfy the NIU general education requirements. See your advisor. Students may skip college algebra if ACT or placement allows.
