This is a common general education transfer curriculum for this Southern Illinois University Carbondale online degree completion program for a bachelor's degree in Business & Administration or Accounting. Consult the website of the college of Business at Southern Illinois University for more information at [business.siu.edu](http://business.siu.edu). See an academic advisor for professional guidance. Admission requirements for the program include 60 transferable credit hours with a minimum 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale, the bolded lower level business courses, and completion of one of the following: SIUC core curriculum, Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) general education core, or an Associate in Arts in Science from an Illinois community college.

Science: at least one class must contain a 4 credit lab course. Fine Art/Humanities: Two courses from Humanities, one course from Fine Arts.

Students are required to have at least 64 credit hours for an Associate in Science or Associate in Arts degree. Students who plan to transfer to SIUC without A.S. degrees will need to be very careful in selecting courses at Lake Land College that will satisfy the SIUC general education requirement as well as prerequisite professional business core courses. See your academic

advisor. All business majors should have a C or better in ENG120, ENG121, and BUS281. Minimum of 2.0 GPA to be accepted to the College of Business.

The Business and Administration degree completion program at SIUC requires 60 hours of junior and senior level course work in order to complete a bachelor of science degree from an AACSB accredited program. The AACSB accreditation is the highest standard of achievement for a business school, world-wide. Many employers look for graduates from an AACSB program, because they have graduated from a quality program. SIUC College of Business is in the top 10% of public colleges of business in the nation.

Students must apply to the University to the Business and Administration (BNAD) program. Courses are taught in 'content areas' during a traditional semester, which include two-eight week classes during the traditional 16 week term. Students may start the program in January, May, or December. The program is eligible for financial aid. Student services, including academic advisement and career placement, are available.
