Majors in the college of Business at SIUE include: Accounting; Business Administration with specializations available in Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, General Business Administration, Human Resource Management, International Business Management, Management Information Systems, and Marketing; Business Economics and Finance; or Computer Management and Information Systems.

Admission to the School of Business at SIUE is through a selective, competitive application process. Students must complete a supplemental application to the School of Business. The minimum cumulative combined GPA required to apply is 2.25 on a 4.0 scale. For summer term, students must pass all of the prerequisite courses by the end of the preceding spring semester; for fall semester, students must pass all of the prerequisite courses at the end of the preceding fall semester. The prerequisites which students must complete with a grade of C or better are: English Composition I and II, Public Speaking, Computer Concepts and Applications, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Financial Accounting, College Algebra and Business Calculus or a regular Calculus course. Students who have been placed through exam or other methodology into a business calculus or a regular calculus course and complete it with a grade of C or higher do not have to go back and take College Algebra or Pre-Calculus. The School of Business seeks to admit students who demonstrate the greatest likelihood of success. Admission decisions are based primarily on the

student's performance in collegiate level work as well as the required essay. In recent admission cycles, the average prerequisite GPA of students admitted is 3.0. Application Deadlines: March 1 for Summer Term and Fall Semester; October 1 for Spring Semester.

No foreign language is required for admission to or graduation from SIUE (except for International Business).

Students who plan to transfer to SIUE without A.S. degrees will need to be very careful in selecting courses at Lake Land College that will satisfy the SIUE Integrated Core general education requirements. See your advisor.
