**Admission Requirements to declare a Psychology Major:** for sophomore standing transfers must have completed: ENG120, ENG121, PSY271, MAT125, + 1 additional PSY course. Junior standing must have completed: ENG120, ENG121, PSY271, MAT125, + 2 additional PSY courses.

A GPA of 3.0 in those courses prior to transfer is expected.

PSY transfer courses that have been articulated are listed on the [TransferReady.org](http://TransferReady.org) (Transferology website). Information concerning non-posted courses may be obtained by contacting the course Articulation Coordinator at 217-333-1891.

PSY students are expected to gain language knowledge equivalent to the completion of the fourth semester of college study in a language. Must complete three years of language other than English in high school or you must take a language placement test to determine the courses in which you should enroll. This can be met in any of the following ways:

1. Successfully completing a fourth-semester college-level course in a language other than English
2. Successful completion, in high school, of the fourth year of a language other than English;
3. Successful completion of the third-semester level in each of two different languages other than English by any combination of high school and college work;
4. Demonstrating proficiency at the fourth-semester level in a language proficiency examination approved by the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the appropriate department.
