A 2.5 GPA (or special permission from the OPD Program Coordinator) is required for admission to EIU OPD program. This is a suggested course sequence. Students must work with their advisor to develop a sequence plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during the fall and spring semesters.
