## ARTICULATION AND TRANSFER AGREEMENT BETWEEN LAKE LAND COLLEGE AND LINCOLN COLLEGE FOR THE BACHELOR OF ARTS IN RADIO, TELEVISION, AND NEW MEDIA

#### Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate the ease of transfer of Lake Land College students and alumni for baccalaureate degree completion in Lincoln College's Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media.

#### LC Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media

The Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media program prepares students for careers in the radio, television, or digital media industries, either as on-air talent or in behind-the-scenes managerial or technical roles. This course of study provides students a convergent view of the media industry, while stressing both theoretical and applied concepts. The program culminates in a capstone course in which students demonstrate mastery of all areas of electronic media necessary to function in a current and future environment of media convergence.

#### Student Admissions Policy

Lincoln College will adhere to its established entrance criteria for admission into the Radio, Television, and New Media degree program. However, any student who has earned an Associate in Applied Science in Radio/TV Broadcasting from Lake Land College <u>and</u> who is participating in this articulation agreement through fulfilling the suggest plan of study shall automatically be admitted into the Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media at Lincoln College, if Lincoln College transfer admissions requirements have been satisfied. Specific admissions requirements for transfer students are located in the Lincoln College catalog available at http://lccatalog.lincolncollege.edu/

#### Articulation Policy

Lake Land College alumni with an earned Associate in Applied Science degree will be considered by Lincoln College to have completed general education requirements provided such student meet those requirements set forth by the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) during their course of study at Lake Land College and/or Lincoln College. Completing the IAI general education program will count as meeting Lincoln College's general education program requirements for graduation.

#### 2+2 Agreement

Upon acceptance and enrollment at Lincoln College and following the completion of their associate of applied science degree, Lincoln College shall be considered the "home" institution for the purposes of financial aid.

Those students wishing to remain at Lake Land College for a fifth semester may apply for admission into the Radio, Television, and New Media Program at Lincoln College for the Spring Semester. Students may take a maximum of 75 hours at Lake Land College for the purposes of packaging financial aid before needing to declare Lincoln College as the "home institution."

#### Tuition Information

Upon transfer to Lincoln College, students shall be subject to all student tuition and fees as published in the Lincoln College Catalog. Information on tuition rates and fees can be found in the Lincoln College Catalog online at http://lccatalog.lincolncollege.edu/

## Responsibilities of each institution Lincoln College agrees to:

- Allow students and alumni of Lake Land College who meet all admissions requirements
  of Lincoln College to complete their third and fourth years of the baccalaureate degree in
  the radio, television, and new media program and receive such a degree subsequent to
  fulfilling all graduation requirements of the Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and
  New Media or any other degree subsequently added to this agreement.
- Fully accept Lake Land College's Associate in Applied Science in Radio/TV
  Broadcasting as satisfying all Lincoln college general education requirements via the IAI
  general education requirements according to the stipulations described above or allow
  students to complete general education deficiencies using IAI general education
  requirements while enrolled at Lincoln College.
- Articulate each of Lake Land College courses to specific Lincoln College courses as
  indicated on the articulation table (Addendum A of this agreement). Lincoln College will
  also apply each of those articulated courses toward the aforementioned degree in radio,
  television, and new media with the goal of maximizing the available transfer credit.
- Encourage all students enrolled at Lake Land College who are seeking transfer to Lincoln College's Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media to complete the requirements of their associate of applied science degree before entering Lincoln College's degree.
- Provide support relevant to the offering of the Radio, Television, and New Media degree
  including academic advisement, academic support, library services, financial aid, and
  career services as offered by Lincoln College.
- Inform Lake Land College of any changes to the program's curriculum or tuition rates in a timely fashion and negotiate, with representatives of Lincoln College, any necessary alterations to this agreement resulting from those changes.
- Inform Lake Land College of the progress of its graduates enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media degree program at the end of each academic year for assessment purposes.
- List Lake Land College as a partner in learning on the Lincoln College website.
- Investigate the possibilities of collaboration in the development of additional agreements regarding other programs and degrees.

#### Lake Land College agrees to:

- Distribute information and materials developed by Lincoln College describing the Bachelor of Arts in Radio, Television, and New Media degree program.
- Provide contact information, when available, for students indicating interest in participation in this agreement following the completion of the student's first 45 credit hours at Lake Land College to ensure ease of transferability. Lincoln College will encourage all students to complete their associate of applied science degree at Lake Land College before transfer.
- List Lincoln College as a partner in learning on the Lake Land College website.
- Identify a liaison with Lincoln College to communicate advisement needs for students, curricular changes, and the distribution of materials produced by Lincoln College advertising the program and agreement for the purpose of ease in transfer by students between the two institutions.
- Inform Lincoln College of any changes to the Associate in Applied Science degree curriculum in a timely fashion and negotiate, with representatives from Lincoln College, any necessary alterations to this agreement resulting from those changes.
- Investigate the possibilities of collaboration in the development of additional agreements regarding other programs.

#### Terms and Provisions of the Agreement

- Representatives of both institutions agree to communicate annually to assess curricular changes and other conditions that may affect the purpose of this Agreement and/or to update or develop new articulation agreements.
- 2. This agreement does not preclude either institution from making curriculum changes if deemed appropriate.
- 3. Appropriate publications and promotional materials regarding this Agreement will be made available to all Lake Land College students through the means described above.
- 4. Either Lincoln College and/or Lake Land College may dissolve this Agreement by giving advanced notice of one year.
