TAP/ACT/SAT Recommendation for Education Majors:

-Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP)

-ACT: Prior to 9/1/2015: MINIMUM COMPOSITE OF 22 WITH English/Writing minimum of 19; 9/1/2015—9/9/2016: minimum composite of 22 with Writing minimum of 16; After 9/9/2016: minimum composite of 22 with Writing minimum of 6.

-SAT: Prior to 3/5/2016: minimum composite score of 1030 (Critical Reading + Mathematics = 1020 or higher) and a minimum score of 450 on Writing; After 3/5/2016: minimum composite score of 1110 (Evidence-based Reading and Writing + Mathematics = 1110 or higher) and a minimum score of 26 on Writing and Language.
 The Basic Skills Requirement should be completed prior to the end of your sophomore year.
 Completion of 3 semesters of a Foreign Language is an ISU Graduation Requirement (see website for further details on alternative completion options).
